Your Character from Your Handwriting **25th January 2016**

Diana Osborn, our speaker, said handwriting can help reveal a person's characteristics. It had even been used in the past by large employers to sift through job application letters. She was delighted to find a third of members had sent a handwritten letter during the past week, though only three had been recipients of such letters.

To help "read" their own writing a short piece of dictation was used completed with a signature. Diana explained the importance of the 'i' needing its dot and 't' the cross bar because where these are placed can show whether you are careful, careless, ambitious or contented. Then a question of the slant of the writing, a preference to hark back to the past or take a rocket ride into the future. The general size of writing showing different traits in your character from the precise and factual to flamboyant and ambitious.

Some were disappointed to hear boring might describe them, however this could be redeemed by the use of their **capital I**.

The variation in the form of this letter is important and the four common styles could show intelligence, an interest in

the 'arts', a self-confidence or a tendency to show off. At this point it was getting interesting to look at the neighbours writing to see if there was a character match between the writing and how members viewed one another.

Finally to the signature—but that would give too much away and there was the scientific finding of the choice between "four shapes" test which gives a back up to the traits found in handwriting. Hopefully members went away with a satisfactory "reading" of their handwriting and, therefore, their character, with a resolve to write more letters.
