

Today the Red Tractor Logo is on £12 billion worth of food and drink annually.

At the 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games all food sourced for the Games had to come from sustainable and trustworthy sources, bearing the Red Tractor stamp of approval.

Encouraging the food industry to produce food from more responsible sources, Red Tractor developed the "made with" range.

John Cookson and I have been updating it and there are now new items on it.


